Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Gal. 6:2, NIV)

I am sure that like me, you will have noticed a change in the weather. A new season is upon us, Autumn! We're still getting lots of sunshine, and the air is crisp and fresh. The trees resemble ornaments designed by a Master Artist, with leaves every shade of red, gold and green. We get to admire the colours as I walk our youngest to school. It's like God has placed beauty all around, even as we go about the mundane and humdrum parts of life.

It was on such a morning last week, when I was feeling like nothing could go wrong in all that beauty, that I was brought down to earth with a bump. More accurately, it was my daughter. The little one suffered a hefty fall off her scooter on the way to school – the leaves might have still looked amazing but I no longer had eyes for them with a shaken and teary little girl to console. I was so grateful when another parent, also on the school run, stopped to check on her and encourage her with some soothing words and a smile. This lady's intervention did the trick, and quickly we were back on our way to school. My little girl was able to leave the nasty business of the fall behind and face the day ahead.

A stranger did a good thing, and it made a difference to me and mine that morning. I have no idea whether she is a Christian or not, but was struck by how her actions seemed to align with the way of Jesus Christ that I quoted at the top - or as the Complete Jewish Bible puts it:

"Bear one another's burdens — in this way you will be fulfilling the Torah's true meaning, which the Messiah upholds."

She didn't have to, but she bore my burden, if only briefly. It is good for us all to practice this within the church as well as outside. There can be times when it happens naturally, like on the school run, while at other times, we can be tempted to recoil because of the difficulty involved.



I have been greatly impressed by the way that people here at St Chads faithfully and diligently contribute towards collections for the food bank. It has been my privilege to help deliver these and although there is no suggestion that we have solved the problem, please believe me when I say that it does make a difference!

Let me encourage you then to continue to do whatever you can, wherever and whenever you can. Remember, this scripture does not charge you with eradicating the problem, nor does it guarantee an outcome. We must not give up! The promise of Galatians 6:2 is that by coming alongside and helping others, you will be satisfying the true meaning of the Law and the prophets – nothing less than the Greatest Commandment to love God and neighbour. That school Mum may never know how much I appreciated her actions, and likewise, we may never fully know the impact of the good that we do at St Chads. Even so, we must press on, because a few verses later in Galatians 6, Paul says this:

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." (Gal. 6:9-10)

Harvest Sunday is only days away as I am writing this, so I'm reminded that our harvest is at hand. All the good work that God has prepared for us to do is within our grasp. May the Holy Spirit spur us to go and reap the Lord's harvest.

The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field (Matt. 9:37-38)




