Admittance Procedure

Identity and Purpose

[Saint Chad's Anglican Pre-School](#) has a clear Christian identity. It operates on the Christian principals of respect for self and others, acceptance of all cultures, responsible behaviour, and enjoyment through the activities we provide. The purpose of Saint Chad's Anglican Pre-School is to provide a safe and welcoming environment where children have the opportunity to take part in a variety of activities and experiences, as we seek to meet the diverse developmental needs of each individual child.

Aims and Objectives

1. Be a community which reflects the love of God in our relationships, standards, and way of life
2. Promote learning about the Life and Ministry of Jesus Christ as well as the beliefs and practises of Saint Chad's Anglican Church
3. Adhere to the OFSTED regulated National Standards, and the New Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum, to promote the welfare and development of children
4. Plan learning and play activities following the Early years foundation stage curriculum programme
5. Work in partnership with parents and carers
6. Play a positive role in helping children separate from their main carer and prepare for primary school
7. Promote and encourage self confidence, self-respect, self-expression, and respect for others
8. Promote social and practical skills through sharing and working together
9. Be positive role models for the children
10. Seek to be a clear reflection in the community of values

As with all Pre-schools and nursery groups we are required by law to have an admittance procedure that is both consistent and fair. With this in mind the Parochial Church Council have agreed the following criteria is to be followed when admitting children into [St. Chad's Anglican Pre-School](#).

Order of priority

1. Children who are eligible for 2 and 3+ year-old education grant funding and:
 - a) Live within the parish boundary of Saint Chad's Chadwell Heath
 - b) Live out side the parish boundary of Saint Chad's Chadwell Heath
2. Children whose referral is supported by an outside agency or professional body
3. Children whose parent /carer is a regular attends of Saint Chad's Anglican Church (by this we mean about twice a month)
3. Date of registration
5. The co-ordinator will make final decision especially taking into consideration the overall balance of the Pre school group
6. When a place becomes available all of those eligible on the waiting list will be considered - according to the order of priority
7. The co-ordinator will contact the parent/carers by post or telephone offering their child a placement
8. A starting date for the child will be provided and agreed upon
9. An opportunity will be given for the parent / carer and child to view our facilities and meet staff prior to starting date
10. Parent s should be aware that admittance to [St. Chad's Anglican Pre-School](#) does not give their child preference when applying to Saint Edwards or other church of England schools. Only regular attendance at Saint Chad's Church (or other)will count towards your application
